The Chi State Learning Is For Everyone (LIFE) Foundation was the brainchild of the Mary Marchi and Jackie Gustafson era of the 1990's. The non-profit status was given in 1999 by the State of California. The first grants were awarded in 2000.

The mission of the LIFE Foundation is to promote and support special projects related to learning and literacy within the State of California. Grants are available to members and non-members alike. This year LIFE awarded over \$12,000 in grants to 24 teachers.

Grand applications, found by selecting the LIFE link on the DKG California homepage, are due by March 1 of each year. Money is dispersed by April 30.

Funds are raised in several ways. One is at a raffle held at convention each year. Also, throughout the year, tax deductible donations may be made by DKG California chapters and areas and to honor or memorialize friends and family. In addition, in 2020 a raffle tickets were sold for a one-week Lake Tahoe vacation. The winner can be found on page 8 of this newsletter.

## **Grant Reports received for 2019-2020**

#### **Oakmont Visual Aids Workshop**

The LIFE Foundation gave a grant to Eta Upsilon's, <u>Oakmont Visual Aids Workshop</u> for three years. The members and other senior volunteers created Braille visual aid concept materials to assist students to achieve reading skills through the use of 38 different tactile aids. The impact of being able to read by touch or sight have encouraged blind, visually impaired or mentally challenged students to focus and learn more. The varied tactile aids are fun to repeat and review. The use of these Braille materials reinforces and promotes independence and self-confidence to enable over 200 students to further discover the pleasures of literacy. #### **Babies and Books**



#### Movie On The Lawn

A grant project for 2019, Movie On The Lawn, was created by the Beta Lambda Chapter and the Tehama County Reading Council. It starts off with a movie that is shown for the community and books are handed out to the children. The intent was for students to continue reading over the summer break. Books were given to children at the Children's Fair, at various mini libraries set up around the community, farmer's market, book mobile sites and through the SERF program throughout the school year and summer program. The project started out with 1,800 books and about 800-900 students have benefited from this. The Chapter members benefited from the joy on children's faces seen while manning the table at the farmer's market and children's fair.





#### A Grant Given in Toni Cook's Mother's Name

A LIFE grant was given to the College Of Adaptive Arts where Larue Foster, Toni Cook's mother, created <u>Foster Makerplace</u>. This space resides in the Library and Media Resource Center under the School of Library Arts and provides opportunities for hands-on learning, acquiring new skills and promoting science literacy. Foster Makerplace is stocked Legos and Lego robotics and mechanical kits as well as crafting items including solder, hot glue and drills. This space is available to professors and students who are able to work on projects between classes. The Foster Makerplace will grow with the students and professors as they create new and challenging courses.

#### **KEEP BOOKS**

A grant project for 2019, Keep Books, provided reading level books for kindergarten, first and second grade students from low income families who might otherwise not have access to them in their homes. This helps the students practice their beginning reading and literacy skills at home. After ordering and receiving the books, the Gamma lota members pack books into labeled bags and bundle them for schools. Several members take the book bags to their Title I schools and make class presentations. They have received hundreds of thank you letters from the kids and some are shown here.



## Treasurer's Report

This was an unusual and challenging year for everyone in so many ways. I am sure it goes without saying that we really missed the crazy work of the raffle, and seeing the wonderful women of DKG in person. Clearly, the lack of a convention raffle will impact the LIFE foundation for a few years. The raffle held at convention each year is typically about half of our funds. It is our hope that Areas and Chapters will find a fun way to raise a bit of money to help make up for the loss we have suffered.

We had to be very conservative with our giving for the 2020 grant round, and had to make some very tough decisions. We awarded 24 of the 29 grants received for a total of \$12,546, which includes one \$200 Helene Going Green grant. Sadly, that was the last Helene Going Green grant as the funding has ended.

As you know, we try very hard to keep our expenses as low as possible. In 2019 our non-grant expenses were 15.83% of our income. In 2020 it was 16.39%, up 0.56%.

On a positive note, our **Amazon Smile** donations are up from .27% to 1.28%. Thank you to all of you who have choose the LIFE Foundation as your charity on Amazon Smile!

## Learning Is For Everyone Foundation (LIFE) Tax ID Use Procedures

- 1. Submit an application to the LIFE Foundation, using the Tax ID Request application, for a grant to fund a project that supports Learning and Literacy. Include a budget indicating the total amount of funds needed, in addition to the grant request sought, to fully fund the project.
- 2. Upon approval of the grant request, solicit monetary donations from people or businesses that want to give a tax deductible donation. The money is sent to the LIFE treasurer with the name, address, and email information of the donor. The LIFE donation form can be used, and the money is sent directly to LIFE. It is critical that you write the grant number on the donation form so it can be accounted for properly.
- \* (Please note that any fundraising activities held by the chapter for the project, such as a raffle, silent auction, book sale or pass the hat, are not tax deductible and do not need to be sent to LIFE.)\*
- 3. A check is then sent to the grant recipient for the amount of money collected.
- 4. The LIFE Foundation sends a letter for the tax deduction to the donor.
- 5. Monetary donations OVER the amount stated in the grant budget, is kept by the LIFE Foundation and used in the next grant round.
- 6. The money is then reported on the FTB 199 and IRS 990.

IMPORTANT NOTE: To use the LIFE Tax ID number to procure a room for rent from someone who gives a lower price to a 501(c)(3), please contact Robin Kelley at 530-317-7729 for the necessary paperwork.
