Examples of Grant Reports for 2022-2023

Harry Potter Unit

Lea Van Diepen, Beta Delta, Area 10 received a LIFE Grant to support her interactive Harry Potter Unit with her 6th grade students. The students were able to use Harry Potter glasses, sorting hats, and magic wands to heighten their engagement with the reading project. The grant funds were also used to purchase Harry Potter books and unit lesson plans.



Sponsor-A-Class

Natalie Kidder from Solano County received a LIFE grant to help support her Sponsor-A-Class program. This program supplies books to Transitional Kindergarten teachers and students in Title 1 Schools. One teacher reported, "Parents have expressed their gratitude for helping their child appreciate reading and storytelling." This teacher also said, "I love that the books provided help start a love of reading and many students also end up getting their library card, too."



Audio Books, An Alternate Path to Reading and Literacy

Shelly Fleming, Eta Chi, Area X, received a LIFE grant to build an audio book library in two Poway School District schools. Some testimonials from students say it all, but it boils down to one third grader who said, "I really like audiobooks. They help me read the books." Many Special Education Teachers agree.

Little Libraries

Margaret Rodrigues and Gamma Alpha, Area V, bought books for the chapter's Little Library Project. The Chapter has four Little Libraries near low-income housing in the Morgan Hill community. Gamma Alpha members monitor and restock the libraries weekly to restock the libraries. Many of the books are bilingual.



Lobby Literacy Plus

Gamma Chi in Area 16 received a LIFE grant and provided books for children of single parents attending Cuyamaca Community College. Several books were English/Arabic bilingual classic books. The parents reported these books helped them improve their own English reading skills.



Literacy for All

Erika Cantrell, Beta Omicron, Area XII, received a grant and she created differentiated book bags filled for students from her Title 1 school for summer reading. She filled the bags with books a stuffed animal depicting a character from the story and a journal. She received many notes from parents saying how thankful they were and how excited their child was to receive the book bags.





Family Engagement

Kristen Silverbush, Epsilon Chi, Area VI, received a LIFE grant to build bookbags for her students to take home and share with their families. Participation exceeded her initial expectation.

This table shows a comparison of this year with the last three years. As you can see, from line 1, our individual, chapter, and area donations have dropped this year compared to the last three years. Our income from the raffle (line2) is still pending but usually around \$4,000. Line 4, our Amazon Smile income, will no longer be available as the program was discontinued by Amazon.

Expenses for the LIFE Foundation vary greatly. The Foundation's operating expenses historically have been very low due to the generosity of the board members. We cannot expect this to continue. We have anticipated expenses of \$6,050 this year. We are making some changes to reduce operating expenses like using the QR code for members to access our newsletter as printing is a large expense. Most expenses occur during convention and are not reported as of this publication date.

The LIFE Foundation was able to fund \$15,561.00 in grants this year and we will be able to meet our financial obligations due to carry-over from last year.
