Grant Reports Received for 2021-2022

Delta Xi Book Project

This past December 2021, the Delta Xi Book Project gave away over 1750 books to both the Vacaville Christmas Wish program and 14 new teachers at Hemlock and Anna Kyle Elementary Schools. About 200 books came from book donations by Delta Xi members and approximately 1600 books were purchased with LIFE grant funds and monetary donations from Delta Xi members and community donations.

Holiday Literacy Project

In early November of 2021, Eta lota Chapter used their 2021 LIFE Grant money to order a variety of children's books through Scholastic, but delivery was delayed due to supply chain issues. Not to be disheartened, members stepped up to the plate in mid-December and donated 145 books for our project. As part of an annual holiday gathering Eta lota members stamped and decorated the books and the evening was filled with fun, fellowship, a simple shared meal, and even a holiday sing-along. The books were donated to the East County Transitional Living Center for holiday gifts to 125 families with children.

The Scholastic book order finally arrived on January 11th, 2022! Members prepared the books with a chapter stamp and a message that encourages reading. The recipient of the gifts, Common Ground, is an organization that works with elementary schools in a low to medium income area of the La Mesa-Spring Valley School District. On February 15th, an Eta lota member accompanied Common Ground to one of the schools they support. Common Ground representatives and Eta lota member helped children select one of the donated books to take home. Books will be distributed to various schools throughout the spring, and Eta lota members will be there. It is wonderful to be able to give books to children at both the transitional living center and the schools. Many have few if any books of their own.


Lobby Literature Grant Award

With this grant, Gamma Chi, Area XVI, purchased new and gently used books for the young children of single parents who are enrolled in Extended Opportunity Programs & Services at Cuyamaca Community College. These children's books were to have been made freely available in the E.O.P.S. Office where the parents go for support and assistance. When Covid restrictions made this impossible, our books were placed in "Welcome Back" backpacks for the single parents to pick up at the beginning of the fall semester. Over 45 children benefitted from the 140 books we delivered at that time.

With the remaining funds, Gamma Chi members were able to purchase another 150 children's books, both new and gently used, to give as gifts during the holiday season. We were particularly pleased to include a variety of well-known children's books written in Arabic, a commonly spoken language among many of the E.O.P.S. families. These books along with member donated gift cards for essential services helped these single parents and their children experience a happier holiday



The past three years have been anything but normal. So, I am going to share with you a picture of the LIFE Foundation's income and expenses over the past four years so you have a better understanding of the finances.

In the chart you can see how our bottom line is still secure but continues to decline. Our income rarely matches the amount of money we spend on grants. In 2021 we did not receive very many grants, donations were generous, and our reserves increased a bit. The income figure for this year, of course, does not include the Raffle or the expenses from Convention. However, the number of grants was 25 and we gave the largest amount of money in years. So, after paying for hotel and travel, I estimate that we will have a reserve of about \$14,000.

Your donations have been generous, and we appreciate that, as do the women who receive the grants. A big thank you to Area 6 who raised \$400 for LIFE at their Founders' Day in honor of Jeannine Hendersen Hodges. Also, thank you Areas 2, 12, and 13 for their generous donations. It is our hope that every Area will eventually hold a small fundraiser each year for LIFE.
